

NURSE AIDE AND HEALTH EDUCATION

Nurse Aides and allied health workers are employed in healthcare-related roles. These skilled healthcare professionals are members of the healthcare team and they typically play an important role in patient care or information management. Employment of Nurse Aides and allied health workers is projected to grow 21 percent from 2012 to 2022, faster than the average for all occupations. Employment opportunities include home health agencies, hospitals, clinics, nursing homes, extended care facilities, and doctor's offices.
